Occupation/ Job description

Creative designer is a person who creates visual concepts, using computer software or by hand, to communicate ideas that inspire, inform, and captivate consumers. They develop the overall layout and production design for applications such as advertisements, brochures, magazines, and reports.

Creative designers also referred to as graphic artists or communication designers, combine art and technology to communicate ideas through images and the layout of websites and printed pages.

Duties of the Occupation/Job

Graphic designers typically do the followings:

- Consult with clients to establish the overall look, graphic elements and content of communications materials in order to meet their needs
- Determine the medium best suited to produce the desired visual effect and the most appropriate way for communication
- Develop the graphic elements that meet the clients' objectives
- Prepare sketches, layouts and graphic elements of the subjects to be rendered using traditional tools, multimedia software and image processing, layout and design software
- Estimate cost of materials and time to complete graphic design
- Use existing photo and illustration banks and typography guides or hire an illustrator or photographer to produce images that meet clients' communications needs
- Establish guidelines for illustrators or photographers
- Co-ordinate all aspects of production for print, audio-visual or electronic materials, such as Web sites, CD-ROMs, interactive terminals, etc.
- Co-ordinate sub-contracting
- Work in a multidisciplinary environment
- Supervise other graphic designers or graphic arts technicians.

Knowledge

- **Photoshop, Illustrator & InDesign:** It is an essential skill to create your own graphic design and there is no way to avoid it either. Almost every job post required applicants to be well versed in using those programs.
- **HTML:** HTML skills are demanded across jobs. Almost one-third of all creative design jobs would require the basics of HTML knowledge.
- **UI/UX design**: UI and UX are not that popular a skill but it's worth knowing
- **3D and animation Software**: 3-D graphics and have skills in animation software related jobs are projected to have better than average growth in future.
- **Other technical Knowledge**: AdobeCS, Microsoft Office, Print Design, Typography, CSS, Web design, Power point, photography, branding,

<u>Skills</u>

- **Coding** basic coding skills are quite useful to designers, particularly when they take on a web design project.
- Understanding digital typography: typography is increasingly digital, and the way different fonts appear online differs from the way they look in print. A deeper understanding of which fonts work best in an online environment is a must. Understand the pixels of different fonts and ones made to scale to different screen sizes, such as mobile devices.

- Environmental graphics: designing environmental graphics requires the ability to look at the design space as a whole and figure out the best use of wall and floor space. To improve your environmental design skills, study largescale design and pay attention to the experience that stores and office buildings create for visitors.
- **Perseverance:** developing perseverance require a few specific steps, such as writing down goals, breaking them into manageable tasks, and tracking progress along the way.
- **Image editing skills:** rich photography part of content strategies of companies and image editing skills are given high priority
- **Color grading:** color grading an create videos that are vibrant and attention grabbing.
